Snohomish Fire District 4 offers you the chance to help others in your community and in your home by saving a life. Our classes will provide you with the skills you need to feel confident in the event of an emergency until higher trained personnel arrive and the ability to use supplies that are available to you in most any environment.

Classes will be held at Station 43, 1525 Ave D, Snohomish.

Certifications are good for 2 years and are recognized by L&I and WISHA. This is not a Health Care Provider Level class.

Class Scheduling and Registration:

CPR/AED & First Aid Classes

CPR includes adult, child, and infant

- Classes are on Saturday, begin at 9:00 a.m., and are approximately 4.5 hours long.
- Class fee is \$60 for non residents, \$30 for residents of Fire District #4. (You can check Snohomish County's Assessor's Property Search Page to see if you live in Fire District 4).
- Payment can be made in the form of cash or check only.
- Class size is limited to 14 students. Mailed registrations with check payment is acceptable.
- Registration and payment must be received before you can be put on class list. No drop-ins. No phone registration.
- You must attend entire class to receive card.

- 32 out of 100 deaths in Washington were caused by accidents.
- The National Safety Council has collected statistics from all over the country and they found:
 - 1.5 million people will have heart attacks every year in the U.S.
 - four times greater than those of a victim who does not receive CPR until after four minutes.
 - When CPR is started within the first four minutes, the victim's chances of leaving the hospital are
